Items ship quickly. If we did this now, we could get things going for Easter. Range of prizes for options. 70% off for teachers' orders.

What would the money be used for? Kids need to understand why they were selling something. Matt has been a part of this fundraiser before, but they didn't offer drop shipping. The drop shipping would be a major improvement. 10% of the students have to sell one item.
